History

In 1958, following the end of the Korean War and the subsequent closure of a United Nations military base in Japan, finding new employment for the Japanese personnel who had worked at the base became an important social issue. With support from relevant government agencies and using equipment formerly operated by the UN forces, Nippon Salvage Service was established to provide employment opportunities for former base workers.

1958 August	Following the closure of the UN military base in Shukuen, Nippon Salvage Service Cooperative was established on August 5 with support from relevant government agencies under the Act on Special Measures for Former Employees of the Stationed Forces.
1960 August	Shiga Branch established (Kusatsu City, Shiga Prefecture)
1962 August	Reorganized from a cooperative into Nippon Salvage Service Co., Ltd. Capital: 3 million yen
1970 June	Nagahama Office established (Nagahama City, Shiga Prefecture)
1979 February	Capital increased to 30,000,000 yen
1997 April	Head Office and Head Office Operations Center relocated to Minami-ku, Kyoto City (current location)
2005 November	Machinery Service (rental) division established
2010 August	Shiga Branch relocated to Koka City, Shiga Prefecture (current location)
2013 September	Maizuru Office established at Maizuru International Wharf
2016 December	Customs clearance license obtained
2017 January	Joined JIFFA
2017 February	Registered as a Type I Freight Forwarding Business Operator
2017 March	Obtained a Type II Freight Forwarding Business License
